



In all dioceses of the U.S. **January 22** shall be observed as a day of prayer for the full restoration of the legal guarantee of the right to life, and as a day of penance for violations to the dignity of the human person committed through acts of abortion. On January 22, 1973, the Supreme Court legalized abortion throughout the United States in its companion decisions Roe v. Wade and Doe v. Bolton. Since that time, millions of children have lost their lives, and millions of women and families have been wounded by abortion. On June 24, 2022, the Dobbs v. Jackson Women's Health Organization decision overturned Roe v. Wade. However, many state and federal laws continue to threaten pre-born children. Great prayer and advocacy are needed. According to Worldometer, a nonpartisan resource, abortion killed 44.6 million people worldwide in 2023, more than any other cause of death. As of January 9, more than a million have been killed by abortion in 2024.

Welcome to New Parishioners Lisa & Jim Baldridge

The faith and wisdom of the Baldridges are gifts to our parish family. Lisa and Jim began attending St. Agnes occasionally for Saturday morning confession and Mass, oftentimes in order to observe the First Saturday devotions. When the pandemic hit, they started attending Sunday Mass here regularly. "St. Agnes was meeting our needs better and there was none of the fearmongering that we saw and heard about in many other parishes. The more we attended, the more we fell in love with St. Agnes. There is a deep reverence that we consider to be a rare and beautiful treasure. We love the altar railing, making it so easy to kneel for Holy Communion. We also love the option of attending the Latin Mass—something that Jim fondly remembers from his childhood, as he was right in the middle of training to be an altar server for the Latin Mass when it suddenly changed to English." Jim and Lisa met during college. Lisa says her future husband "was one of those rare students who still went faithfully to Mass every Sunday, and he always invited me to go with him. I was raised in a strong Christian home, in the Methodist faith,

but I knew next to nothing about the Catholic faith. Jim answered about a million questions for me, and I converted in 1978, the year before we were married, thanks be to God!" The Catholic faith has been an essential part of the Baldridges' marriage and family, as they strive to adhere to Church teachings and traditions even amid the many conflicting mindsets in the world. They have raised two daughters and a son. In 1984, Jim was hired by a new Catholic high school in the diocese, now known as St. Michael the Archangel, where he taught French and science for 38 years, retiring in 2022. Lisa taught Spanish at the same school from 1989 until this past May, when she retired after 34 years of service. The couple says they loved their teaching vocation; "we especially loved teaching at a Catholic high school where faith and prayer were everyday elements in the classroom. We feel that we were not just teachers over the many years, but also witnesses to the Catholic faith that was so essential in our daily lives." When asked if they have any advice to offer husbands and wives, Jim and Lisa answered, "it would be to pray together every day—the Rosary, Divine Mercy Chaplet, Morning Offering, mealtime prayers, Mass, adoration, retreats—whatever works best in your family." They also recommend making your home a clear reflection of your Catholic faith, so that anyone visiting can say, "Oh, these people are Catholic!" A priest friend of theirs told them that one of the most important responsibilities as a husband or wife is to help bring your spouse to salvation. "We take this quite seriously. You will go through many trials and tribulations in your marriage and family, so hold tight to each other and to God, and don't waste those sufferings!" After about three years of regularly attending Mass at St. Agnes, they decided to make it official when their oldest daughter married at St. Agnes last September. "We are delighted to be registered members!" In December, the Baldridges went on the parish pilgrimage to the Shrine of the Most Blessed Sacrament in Hanceville, Alabama.
