NOVENA PRAYER FOR EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL WEEK ONE

"Behold, I stand at the door and knock. If anyone hears my voice and opens the door, I will enter his house and dine with him, and he with me." *-Revelation 3:20*





On February 3, the Church celebrates St. Blaise, a third-century Armenian bishop who was renowned for effecting miraculous cures and for courageously reproaching Roman officials in his home region of Cappadocia for their intolerance of the practice of Christianity. For both reasons, the governor ordered the bishop's arrest, and he took to the wilderness, continuing his ministry in caves. It was said that wild animals came to him for healing and gathered around his cave, while Blaise walked among them unafraid. One story tells of a woman whose piglet was carried off by a wolf. She reported the theft to the bishop, knowing of his rapport with animals. Blaise called for the wolf and commanded the piglet be returned to its owner. The wolf obeyed. The piglet's owner reciprocated Blaise's kindness when he was eventually captured and imprisoned, by bringing him candles to illuminate his dark, cold, damp cell, enabling him to read Scripture. For centuries St. Blaise has been invoked against maladies of the throat, perhaps originating

from his part in a child's recovery from choking or another throat ailment. The blessing of throats on February 3, St. Blaise's feast day, commemorates that miracle and is often done with candles blessed the day before, February 2, Candlemas, also reflecting the woman's gift to Blaise while in prison. The saint was cruelly tortured and then beheaded after refusing to offer incense to the image of Caesar and Roman gods, though doing so would have won him freedom.


