NOVENA PRAYER FOR EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL WEEK EIGHT

The Eucharist is Someone, not something: Our Lord Jesus, fully present here and now! Belief in that doctrine is not enough. Actions must align with belief. *Adoration* of Him is necessary. At Mass, we adore both actively (gesture, vocal prayer, song) and contemplatively (gazing wordlessly upon Him). For nine Sundays, we will pray together the Eucharistic Revival novena prayers on the pamphlet in the pews. We are also encouraged to spend an hour in adoration before Him each week.



The man who loves his life in this world is a man who puts more sweat, tears, and time into this world than he does into the kingdom of God. If we live as though this passing, temporal world is our highest priority, it necessarily means that we have placed something that is good, because it is from God, above the greatest Good, which in turn pits that good thing against God. Some might argue—as many critics of Christianity do that such thinking forms people who are so heavenly minded they are of no earthly good. In reality, the Christian who is oriented toward his final destination and who lives with the hope of heaven is of the greatest earthly good, for he rightly perceives the place and value of this world. After all, no man has ever been more heavenly minded than Jesus Christ, and no man has ever done more earthly good than Jesus Christ. Meanwhile, human history is marked with the tragic and bloody remains of those destroyed by men who were so earthly minded that they were of no heavenly or earthly good. St. Irenaeus, in his famous work, "Against Heresies," observed that a kernel of wheat "falling into the earth and becoming decomposed rises and is multiplied by the Spirit of God, who contains all things. And then, through the wisdom of God, it serves for our use when, after receiving the Word of God, it becomes the

Eucharist, which is the body and blood of Christ. In the same way our bodies, being nourished by it, and deposited in the earth and suffering decomposition there, shall rise at their appointed time." The God-fearing Greeks who came to Jerusalem to worship during the Passover said, "Sir, we would like to see Jesus." This is the desire of those who know this world is not enough; they want to see and know the One who is Truth. And when the Eucharist is lifted up at Mass, we do see Jesus. We receive him completely. Having died with him in baptism, we will one day, by God's grace, rise with Him at our appointed time.

St. Darerca

Feast Day March 22 Patroness of Valentia Island

St. Darerca of Ireland (d. 5th century), was a sister of St. Patrick. Much obscurity attaches to her history, and it is not easy to disentangle the actual facts of her life from the network of legend which medieval writers interwove with her However, her fame, apart from



her relationship to Ireland's national apostle, stands secure as not only a great saint but as the mother of many saints. St. Darerca was twice married, first to Restitutus the Lombard, after whose death she married Chonas the Briton, who founded the church of Both-chonais, now Binnion, Parish of Clonmany, in the barony of Inishowen, County Donegal. She had families by both husbands, bishops. When St. Patrick visited Bredach, as we read in sister's sons, namely, St. Reat, St. Nenn, and St. Aedh, who are commemorated respectively on 3 March, 25 April, and 31 August. Other saintly sons are St. Mel of Ardagh, St. Rioc of Inisboffin, St. Muinis of Forgney, County Longford, St. Maelchu, St. Sechnall of or Darerca, whose feast is on 6 July. Source: newadvent.org


