NOVENA PRAYER FOR EUCHARISTIC REVIVAL WEEK NINE

The Eucharist is Someone, not something: Our Lord Jesus, fully present here and now! Belief in that doctrine is not enough. Actions must align with belief. *Adoration* of Him is necessary. At Mass, we adore both actively (gesture, vocal prayer, song) and contemplatively (gazing wordlessly upon Him). For nine Sundays, we will pray together the Eucharistic Revival novena prayers on the pamphlet in the pews. We are also encouraged to spend an hour in adoration before Him each week.

The hour of Redemption was at hand. My Heart could no longer restrain its love for mankind nor bear the thought of leaving them orphans. So to prove My tender love for them, and in order to remain always with them till time has ceased to be, I resolved to become their food, their support, their life, their all. Could I but make known to all souls the loving sentiments with which My Heart overflowed at my Last Supper when I instituted the sacrament of



the Holy Eucharist. . . . My glance ranged across the ages and I saw the multitudes who would receive My Body and Blood and all the good It would effect. . . . How many hearts I saw that from Its contact would bud forth virginity! . . . And how many others that It would awaken to deeds of charity and zeal! . . . How many martyrs of love did I see. . . . THE TRISAGION

At the end of the Divine Mercy chaplet we find a triple invocation, reminiscent of the Holy, Holy, Holy offered by the angels in heaven (Isaiah 6:3). The concluding prayer is: "Holy God, Holy Mighty One, Holy Immortal One, have mercy on us and on the whole world." This is an ancient prayer, known in Greek as the Trisagion, prayed not only in the Byzantine liturgy but also across the East in the Syriac, Coptic, and Armenian liturgies (meaning that in praying the chaplet, we are united in this prayer with other ancient Christian Churches). It also makes an appearance in the liturgy of Good Friday during the Improperia, or "Reproaches" at the ceremony of the Adoration of the Cross, which connects it to the Divine Mercy novena beginning on this day. The brief hymn is sung by two choirs alternately in Greek and Latin, as follows: First Choir: Agios o Theos (O Holy God). Second Choir: Sanctus Deus. First Choir: Agios ischyros (Holy, Strong). Second Choir: Sanctus fortis. First Choir: Agios athanatos, eleison imas (Holy, Immortal, have mercy on us). Second Choir: Sanctus immortalis, miserere nobis. The prayer is certainly of great antiquity; it was one of the exclamations of the

Fathers at the Council of Chalcedon (451), and not only is it common to all the Greek Oriental liturgies, but was used also in the Gallican Liturgy, suggesting from such a widespread and apparently common use the conclusion that the hymn is extremely ancient, perhaps of apostolic origin.

In the Divine Mercy Diary, St. Faustina relates: "The Lord told me to say this chaplet for nine days before the Feast of Mercy. It is to begin on Good Friday. By this novena, I will grant every possible grace to souls" (no. 796).

For each of the nine days, our Lord gave Saint Faustina a different intention: All mankind, especially sinners; the souls of priests and religious; all devout and faithful souls; those who do not believe in God and those who do not yet know Jesus; the souls who have separated themselves from the Church; the meek and humble souls and the souls of little children; the souls who especially venerate and glorify His mercy; the souls detained in purgatory; and souls who have become lukewarm. "I desire that during these nine days you bring souls to the fountain of My mercy, that they may draw therefrom strength and refreshment and whatever grace they have need of in the hardships of life, and especially at the hour of death" (Diary, 1209).

PLENARY INDULGENCES DURING HOLY WEEK

Holy Thursday: Recite or sing "*Tantum Ergo*" during solemn reservation of the Blessed Sacrament. Or Half hour of adoration before the reserved Blessed Sacrament. Good Friday: Veneration of the cross during the celebration of the Lord's Passion. Or participation in the Stations of the Cross.

Holy Saturday: Praying five decades of the Holy Rosary with one or more other people. Or attending the Easter Vigil and renewing your baptismal promises.

Also required: Holy Communion that day; Confession within 20 days; prayers for pope's intentions; and detachment from all sin.
